The Reason for Romans

The Reason that Paul wrote Romans has been endlessly debated as the reason for Paul's writing is never explicitly expressed. John Stott notes that there are three criteria in order to sufficiently argue for why Paul writes:

- Paul's context
- The context in Rome
- The content of the letter

Paul's Context

- Paul is commonly agreed to have written the letter from Corinth
- Paul is most likely on his third missionary journey
- Paul's time of writing is commonly dated between 55CE and 57CE

The Context in Rome

- Claudius wrote an edict in 49CE that expelled the Jews from Rome
- Claudius died around 54CE which allowed the Jews to return to Rome
- The Jews very likely faced problems re-integrating with the Gentile churches on their return
- Paul was aware of the situation in Rome and had in mind to address conflict between the Jews and Gentiles

Paul's Plan for Spain

- Paul had intentions of a missionary journey to Spain
- The first half of Romans looks very much like a missionary support letter
- Rome would have been a perfect home base for Paul's mission to Spain
- Considering the content of the whole letter, it is unlikely that this is the sole reason for Paul's writing.

An Apologetic Letter

- This is the traditionally accepted view for Paul's writing
- This is an important and obvious element of Paul's letter, but focusing solely on this is negligent of the context of the letter.

Conclusion

The length of Paul's letter indicates there is more than one purpose for Paul's writing. Paul's motives for writing may well have been to certain extents, all of the above. Though readers can never be certain as to why Paul writes, by examining the context, there is a reasonable insight to be gained.
